The research, published by the Alcohol Health Alliance, concludes that if a limit is put on alcohol advertising, people may find other ways of learning about drinking, for example through word of mouth. Lead author of the study, Dr David Pratt from the University of Birmingham, said: "It suggests that people may have less information available to them and therefore may have to rely more on their own personal networks. This has important implications for understanding the impact of different alcohol policy messages - if there is less information for drinkers to use, then it is difficult to infer what effect, if any, different messages would have on drinking behaviour." The study analysed data from a national survey that took place in the Republic of Ireland in 2005.
